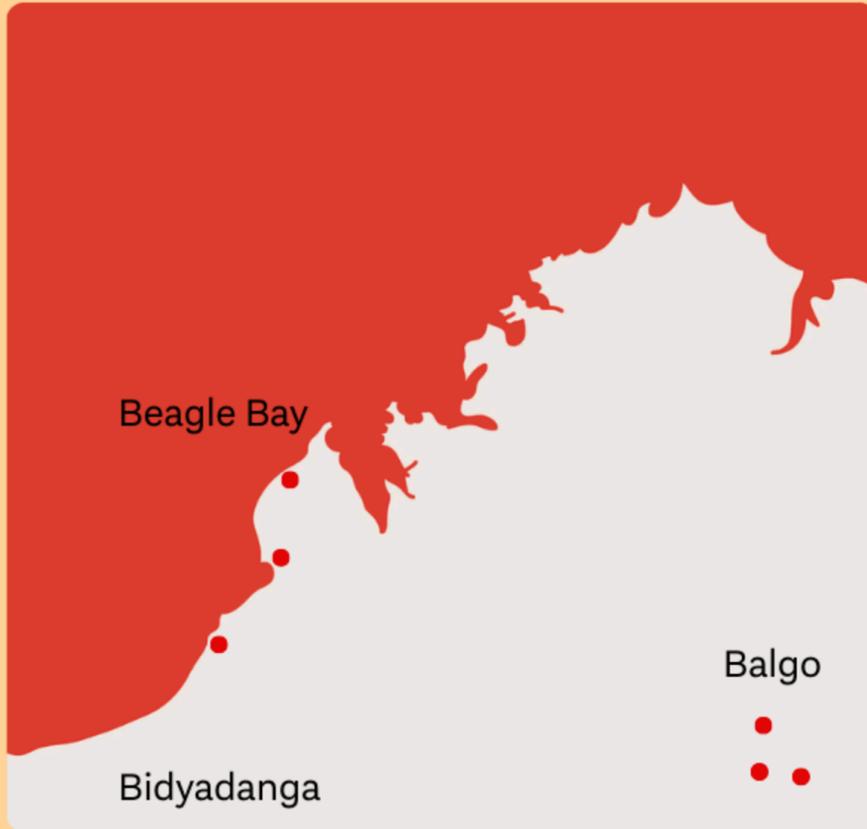

## What is the ICB Program

The ICB program supports Aboriginal people with disability in remote Kimberley communities. We aim to build their capacity, confidence, and wellbeing through culturally appropriate and community - driven supports through meaningful engagement and collaboration.

### **we work alongside communities to:**

- Building skills, knowledge, and confidence
- Supporting families and carers
- Strengthening leadership and inclusion
- Understand and stand up for their rights
- Feel proud of their identity
- Connect with others and reduce isolation
- Navigate services and supports with confidence
- Make independent life choices

## Meet The Team

Based in Broome, our team travels across the Kimberley to sit down, listen, and yarn with community. We work alongside people with disability, families, and carers to design culturally strong and locally relevant supports.. Both staff are from the Broome community. One brings lived experience of disability. Together, we bring deep local knowledge, cultural understanding, and a passion for self-determination.

Hello, my name is Lenard. I am a proud Yawuru, Karajarri, and Torres Strait Islander man, raised in Broome and the Kimberley region. I have dedicated seven years to working with KAMS in Social and Emotional Wellbeing, and I have recently transitioned to Kimberley Supports.



Hello, my name is Seqoiah. I am a 23-year-old woman from the Bardi and Noongar nations, and I spent most of my life in Broome. I have been working with KAMS for three years and look forward to many more incredible opportunities ahead.



## Project and Activities

### Community Consultation

- Listening sessions in target communities (e.g., Bidyadanga, Beagle Bay, Balgo)
- Engagement with people with disability, Elders, families, and service providers
- Co-design of locally relevant resources and supports

### Resource Development

- Plain English and visual materials on disability rights and services
- Resources developed in local languages where possible
- Accessible formats for people with low literacy or communication needs

### Peer Support Programs

- Regular peer-led group sessions for Aboriginal people with disability
- Safe spaces for sharing, connecting, and building strength

### Disability Rights Awareness Campaigns

- Local campaigns using posters, videos, radio, and events
- Aimed at promoting respect, inclusion, and community understanding

### Capacity Building Workshops

- Skills-based workshops (e.g., digital literacy, communication, navigating services)
- Facilitated by local leaders and those with lived experience

### Mentoring Initiatives

- One-on-one and small group mentoring
- Focus on confidence, goal-setting, and leadership
